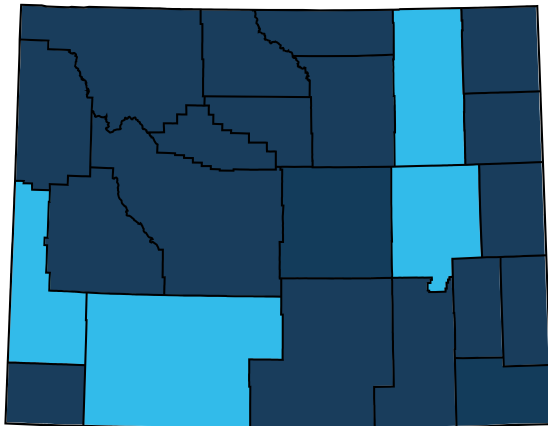

INVESTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Since 2021, Wyoming energy communities have been selected for more than **\$994 million** in federal investments and more than **\$3.2 billion** private sector investments.

TerraPower Nuclear Plant

Lincoln County, WY

- \$2 billion in funding from the U.S. Department of Energy to support the construction of the first commercial nuclear reactor in the state.
- The reactor will support more than 250 on-site jobs and generate enough electricity to power 400,000 homes.

Campbell County

- \$2.8 million from the U.S. Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration to develop infrastructure for a heavy business park that will spark job creation.
- Investments are expected to create more than 90 jobs and generate \$25 million in private investment.
